

2007 Oregon CAFO Program Summary



CAFOs in Oregon

- **Confined** Animal Feeding Operations (CAFOs) as defined in OAR 603-074-0010(3)
 - Oregon Rule defines CAFOs that are much smaller facilities than EPA defines.
 - An animal feeding operation that is subject to regulation as a **concentrated** animal feeding operation pursuant to 40 CFR 122.23.
 - All dairies in Oregon registered to a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permit.

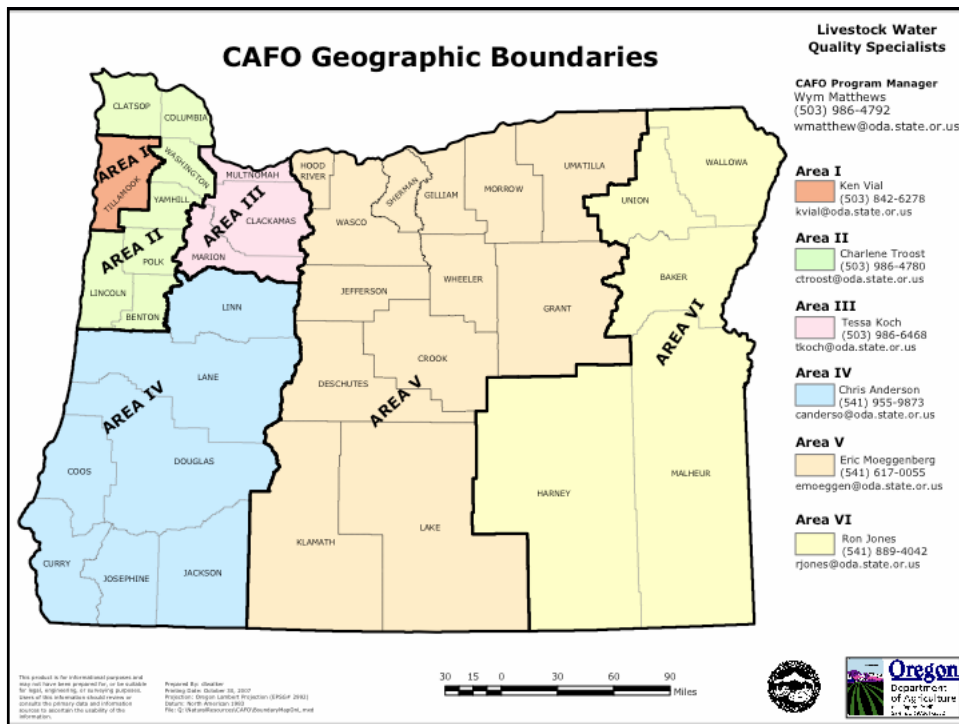
CAFOs in Oregon

- 700 or more mature dairy animals or 1000 dairy heifers, confined for 45 days or more.
- 200 to 699 mature dairy animals or 300 dairy heifers, confined for 45 days or more, with a system that stores, transfers or treats manure and contaminated runoff; or animals are in direct contact with live water in the confinement area; or the facility is discharging to surface or ground waters of the state.
- <200 mature dairy animals or <300 dairy heifers, confined for 4 months or more (120 days or more) that have any type of liquid manure or storm water storage facility or are discharging to surface or ground waters of the state.

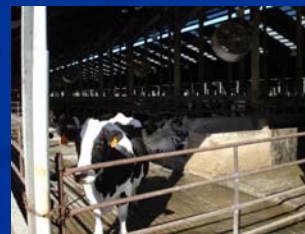
