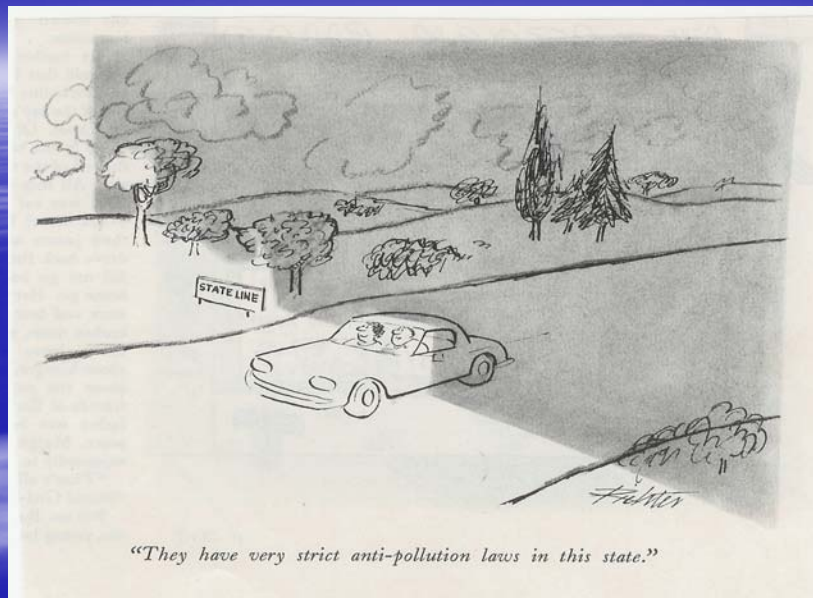

Pendleton Air Pollution Control Ordinance

- Enacted June, 2008
- Restrictions on Wood Stove Burning
- Restrictions on Open Burning
- Daily AQ Forecast, Oct. 1-June 15
- Fines up to \$500



Wood Stove Replacement Program

- Replace an old wood stove or wood stove insert
- No-interest loan of up to \$3500
- Owner chooses replacement heating system
- Owner chooses a contractor from a list of approved contractors
- Owner submits initial application to City for review

Wood Stove Replacement Cont.

- City reviews and approves or denies application
- Upon approval, owner works with contractor
- Old wood stove must be properly disposed of at PSSI
- Must obtain all permits and have all required inspections

Wood Stove Replacement Cont.

- Once all forms are submitted, City prepares a lien agreement for signature by owner
- Lien is filed with Umatilla County
- City releases funds to pay contractor (or owner)
- Owner repays loan over 60 months at no interest
- Max. payment ~ \$60

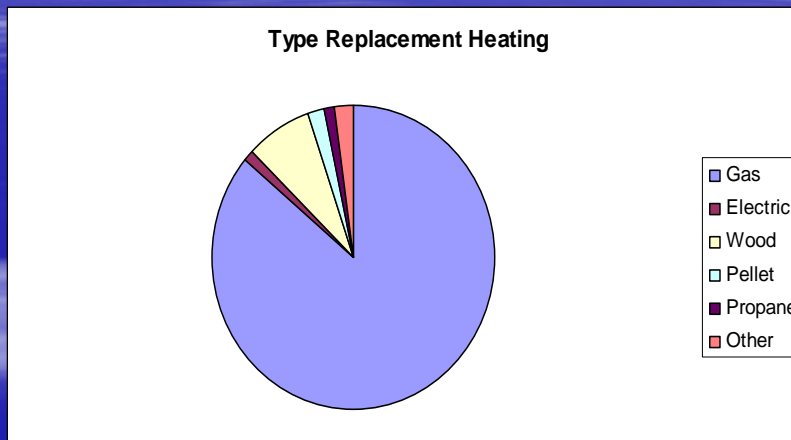

 - Low-Income Loans, 1% Rate, 20-yr payback
 - >62, Low-Income, Grants available
 - Leaky Roofs, Unsafe Wiring, Faulty Plumbing, Poor Heating
 - Cannot replace with a wood stove
