ORS 459A.110 and 459A.115, and ORS 340-97-110 and -120 require a person who transports solid waste (generated in Oregon) out of the State of Oregon to a disposal site that receives "domestic solid waste" to pay a solid waste disposal fee of 81 cents per ton (\$.50/ton plus \$.31/ton). In addition, ORS 459.236 and OAR 340-97-120 require such persons to submit a fee of 13 cents per ton for remedial action under the Orphan Site Account.

Domestic solid waste must be reported by county of origin.

Exemptions: The following types of out-of-state disposal sites do not qualify as receiving "domestic solid waste," and thus any Oregon waste delivered to such sites is exempt from this Uniform Application fee:

- (1) A disposal site limited to ONLY building demolition or construction wastes and land clearing debris;
- (2) An industrial waste facility;
- (3) An ash monofill receiving ash from an energy recovery facility;
- (4) A facility authorized by permit to store, treat or dispose of both hazardous waste and solid waste;
- (5) A site not required to have a solid waste permit, and which receives ONLY "clean fill" (soil, rock, concrete, brick, building block, tile or asphalt paving).

The following are also exempt from the fee: source-separated recyclable materials (including yard debris if it is delivered to a yard-debris compost facility), and sewage sludge or septic tank and cesspool pumpings. Waste that is approved for use as daily cover by local permitting authorities, and that is used for daily cover, is also exempt.
