Dear Col. Butler:

EPA Region 10 has completed a file review and hazard ranking system (HRS) PRescore evaluation for the Bradford Island Landfill located at the Bonneville Locks and Dam. The file were evaluated in accordance with 40 CFR Part 300 Appendix A, which EPA's HRS used to evaluate federal facilities for inclusion on the National Priorities List (NPL).

From our evaluation, EPA has determined the site does not score high enough to be proposed for the NPL. Therefore, a recommendation of no further remedial action planned (NFRAP) will be included in the Federal Agency Hazardous Waste Compliance Docket. If new or additional information becomes available that suggests the site may score high enough to be proposed for the NPL, EPA will reevaluate the site accordingly.

EPA's NFRAP designation does not relieve your facility from complying with appropriate state regulations. The Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act (SARA) of 1986, Section 120 (a) (4) requires federal facilities to comply with state cleanup requirements and standards when not listed on the NPL. In this light, the COE should continue to work with the Oregon Department of Environmental Quality to determine whether removal of debris that may contain hazardous waste has been disposed in the Columbia River near the landfill.

Bradford Island Landfill will not be removed from the Federal Agency Hazardous Waste Compliance Docket, but as noted earlier, will be listed for no further action by EPA. If you have any questions concerning this determination, you may contact me at 206-553-1808.
